

Louisville Metro Police Foundation Annual Report – July 1, 2015 – June 30, 2016

Our mission is to help ensure that Louisville is one of America's safest cities by using private donations to provide the Louisville Metro Police Department and its officers with essential equipment and programs not covered by our tax dollars.

Year in Review

From events to fundraising/grant support, to public awareness, the Foundation made strides in every aspect of our mission of making Louisville a safer place to live, work, play and visit.

Grant Support:

- Kosair Charities provided a \$35,000 child community initiative grant, a \$25,000 pediatric grant to support the children of our officers with medical needs, \$2,000 to purchase new child car seats for all LMPD Divisions and the Crimes Against Children Unit. In addition, they graciously provide us with free office space.
- The annual generosity of Texas Roadhouse, our founding organization, continued this year with a \$50,000 donation as well as providing the food and service for Boots, Badges and Bids and the Chief's/LMPF Holiday Luncheon. This helped fund much needed training and equipment as well as provided support for our Officer in Distress fund.
- Thorntons Inc., also a founding member of the Foundation, provided a \$10,000 contribution at Boots, Badges and Bids which just so happened to be hosted at the beautiful home of Matt and Fran Thornton on August 29, 2015. This grant assisted with obtaining equipment needed for our SWAT team and K-9 Unit.
- Delta Dental provided a \$10,000 grant in October for a new Foundation initiative called Cops Fighting Cavities. This program provides our officers with toothbrushes, floss and toothpaste that they can give out to children across our community.
- Brown-Forman once again stepped up and provided the Foundation a \$16,500 grant which assisted us in the 2015 Boots, Badges and Bids fundraiser.
- PNC Bank awarded the Louisville Metro Police Foundation a \$1,000 grant to focus on juvenile violence related issues and help support the Youth Police Advisory Council.
- Through two generous grant donations from the Franklin Law Group, our 9th Mobile Division obtained K-9 Maverick and our SWAT team has a new training and briefing facility. Carbide Industries and Titan Research & Development provided additional support of our SWAT Team.
- The Louisville Metro Police Explorer Program received a \$10,000.00 grant from UPS to fund the 2016 Kentucky Explorer Academy held at Cambellsville University. The Explorers received an additional \$5000.00 grant from Bridgeman Foods/Manna Inc. for them to attend the 2016 National Explorer Academy held in Flagstaff, Arizona.
